What is it about?

Aimed at professionals and craftspeople, this course is an introduction to ironwork as a craft that will teach delegates basic principles of assessing historic ironwork in situ and make decisions relating to its care. Lectures on covering aspects such as metallurgy in wrought irons and steels, tools and materials, design, manufacture, traditional techniques and fixings will be complemented by a site visit to survey and record historic ironwork. The tutors, themselves craftspeople and acknowledged experts in the field of historic ironwork conservation, will discuss any observations and findings so that specifying repairs of an appropriate standard can be considered.
